Germany Protests Against Dismissal of Her Ministers From Greece.

Washington, Nov. 29.—In a note delivered to Secretary Lansing to-day from Count von Bernstorff, Germany protests against the ejecttion of the German, Austrian, and Turkish Legations from Greece, and asks that the state department forward the protest to Great Britain.

The text of the note, signed by
Count von Bernstorff, and addressed to Secretary of State Lansing.

follows:
"The French commander of the naval forces of the Entente in the Greek waters has notified the Envoys of Germany, Austria-Hungary, Turkey and Bulgaria that they had to leave Greek territory immediately with the staff of their Legations and of the Consulates. "The German Empire most em-

phatically protests against this contempt of international law, of the free will of a neutral country, and of the most elementary rules of international courtesy. "Acting under instructions from the Imperial government, I have the

honor to request your Excellency to forward this protest to the British government.

Forwarded to Britain. Germany's protest will be sent on part of the ordinary routine of the State Department. The note re-quires no other action on the part of this Government, which is involved only because it represents Ger-

man interests in England. Scores of similar notes have been transmitted through the department from both sides as part of the courrepresenting belligerent interests in
