Curtis secretary and manager of the Granite Coal & Fuel company, accused Frank Fairbanks, president of the company, this morning with underhanded methods and sharp paactice in answer to the suit brought against him about three weeks ago in the Third district court in which To Have and to Hold. he is charged with appropriating Audrey. about \$7,000 of the company's Prisoners of Hope, money to his own use. Between March 19 and May 11, 1909, Beverly of Graustark Curtis asserts that Fairbanks drew Graustark out of the cash register about \$750 and went to Canada, without The Doctor rendering an account. Besides The Virginian -Owen Webster this, he declares that Fairbanks is in the grocery business in Salt Lake and that Fairbanks would deposit the money from his private business in the name of the company and then draw it out When Wilderness Was King every little while. In doing this Curtis said that it was impossible to keep an account of the fuel company's business. Fairbanks profited from this arrangement, he says Fairbanks is also charged The Hound of the Baskervills with building a barn out of the profits of the comyany. He Where the Trail Divides attempted to keep it a secret from Curtis, he says. Sidwell, who is A Chance Acquaintance also a director of the company was associated with Fairbanks in his deal avers. Curtise says that By Wit of Woman. the company owes him \$554 for his services and \$120 for rent, and he asks judgement for this amount

In answer to the suit brought against him Curtis denies that the company did \$21,000 worth of business while he was manager and the \$7,000 of it was profit. He states that with A. M. Faldima and George Sidwell that he leased some ground at 139 east Second South street, and erected a building on it as a matter of speculation for rent.
