Greenspond—Fish very scarce, plenty caplin, weather fine.

Nipper's Hr.—Just a sign of fish, plenty caplin.

Hr. Grace—Traps very little, boats 1 to 2 quintals, plenty caplin.

Baine Hr., P.B.—Fish and caplin plentiful to-day.

Fortune—Caplin plentiful, boats and dories average about 3 1/2 qtls. each; traps 45 qtls.

Bonne Bay—Wind moderate and fine. Traps from 3 to 15 qtls., hook and line 1 to 3 qtls; caplin plentiful.

Flower's Cove—From Flower's Cove West to Ferrole fishing good; from Flower's Cove East to Eddies Cove, prospects bright.

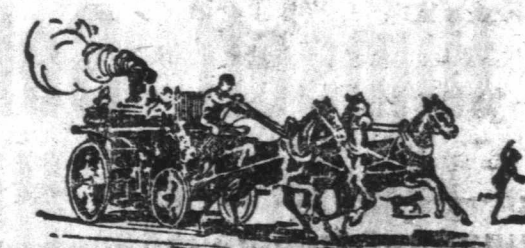

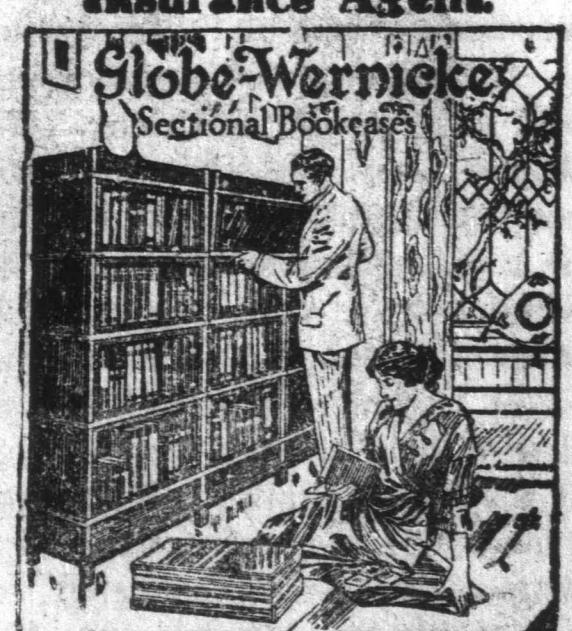
