"Red" Fish

We omitted to state that we were indebted to Mr. D. J. Davies, Government Analyst, for the Report issued by the Canadian Scientific and Industrial Research Committee on the "Red Discoloration of Cured Codfish," from which we gave such full extracts yesterday. The introduction to the report states that the infection does not appear until after storage in warm surroundings or in tropical climate. This points to the great disadvantage of our consigning and sending over fish to the Mediterranean markets, to be put in stores over there, when it would keep so much better in our own comparatively cool climate. Naturally the times call for as good an article of food as we can put up, and the people to-day demand better cured fish than formerly, so that this "redness" is something which should engage our serious attention.

We must eliminate all possibility of loss from this cause, in order to meet the increasingly keen competition of other countries.

Methodist Garden Party

As previously announced the Methodist Garden Party will be held on July 12th, and it promises to be an event of exceptional interest. It will be "all for children," the proceeds to be divided equally between the Methodist Orphanage and the Methodist College Athletic Fund.

The magnificent gift of the athletic grounds on Pennywell Road, presented by C. P. Ayre, Esq., has been greatly enlarged by his generous presentation this year of a large acreage extending some 800 feet on Freshwater Road, 500 feet on Pennywell Road, and bounded on the east by Linscott's Lane and on the west by O'Dea's Lane. For three seasons now the Committee have been working on a portion of the property, and have completed the football grounds, a cinder race track, three tennis courts, and the junior playground. Nor has tree planting been overlooked, some one hundred and fifty now adorning the grounds.

The forthcoming picnic is under the auspices of the united Methodism of the city. Associated with the main committee, of which Mr. J. C. Pratt is the Chairman, Mr. P. H. Hudson, the Secretary, and Mr. Albert Soper, the Treasurer, are ten active committees, aggregating a hundred or more of efficient workers. The sports and side shows will be under the direction of Mr. James S. Ayre, who did such successful work in this direction last year. Provision will be made for from 20 to 25 tables and for the accommodation of about 1,500 guests. Tennis tournaments will be amongst the attractions and there is a possibility of some outport teams competing.

The affair is being looked forward to with keen enjoyment, and a day memorable for its pleasure and big with financial results for both Orphanage and College is confidently anticipated. The committees and the caterers will do their part; and as mid-July generally brings with it the best days of Newfoundland's delightful summer hopes for bright and warm weather promise realization.

Merrill, 24, of Bedford Hills, N.Y., and Durley Merrill of the same place, a sub-freshman who has graduated from Middlesex, is the Grenfell representative on the Phillips Brooks house committee on Missions, and with his brother will be detailed to Indian Hill, Labrador.
