

Two more heavy falls of cliff have occurred at Dover. On the 13th ult., a large quantity of chalk, estimated at two hundred tons, became detached from the scene of the previous accident, and falling upon the outbuildings of the cottages below, completely buried them. A young man named Shoe mith was in one of the out-houses, and was entombed for two hours. His life was saved through the shelter afforded by a cistern, but he was much exhausted when got out. On Tuesday a boat twenty tons fell near the Abbott Cliff, a tunnel of the South Eastern railway (Shakespeare's Cliff). A staff of men were immediately despatched from the Dover station, who in a very short time cleared the line of the rubbish, thus preventing any delay to the traffic. A few tons of chalk again fell at East Cliff during the night.

The number of book sellers in France and her dependencies is returned at 5,674; that of printing offices, at 1399; and that of lithographic establishments, at 1,624. About one-fifth of the first-class, one eighth of the second, and one fourth of the third are in Paris. There are 2,303 periodicals, of which 846 are in Paris.

It is a curious fact with regard to the Presidents of the United States who have been elected to fill a second term of office that only two, Lincoln and Grant, had a son at the time of re-election. Of the others some had only daughters and the remainder were bachelors or childless.

The steam screw troop-ship Himalaya from Portsmouth, twenty-three days out, bound to Halifax and Bermuda, arrived at this port on Sunday morning short of coal and provisions. The Himalaya has on board three Batteries Royal Artillery, a detachment of engineers, and detachments of the 53rd and 87th regiments. She will leave on Tuesday or Wednesday for Halifax.

On Nov. 23rd, while lying in Devonport harbor, the Himalaya lost eight of her men by drowning. They had hired a waterman's boat to go on board their ship. The boat was small, and was struck by a sea and capsized.—Chronicle, Jan. 27.

Newspapers, each..... 2 "
Prepayment compulsory.
