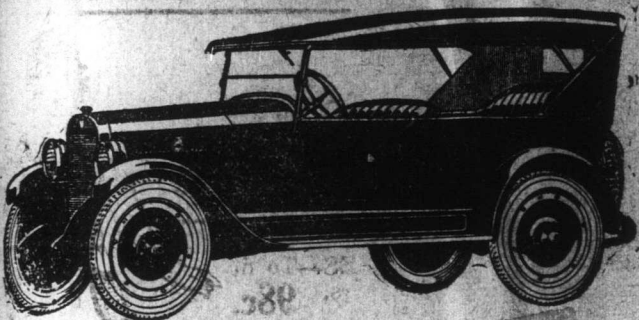

The Daily Questionnaire.

THURSDAY, June 15.

Mr. Moore—To ask Hon. the Minister of Marine and Fisheries if traveling delegate Boone described in messages to the Advocate as holding meetings of the F.P.U. in different northern settlements is the Rev. Francis Boone of Medford, Mass., who was connected with the purchase of a lot of furs from the Department of Marine and Fisheries last winter; and if so, is it correct that he is engaged in the purchase of furs at the present time, and if so, is he purchasing these furs on account of the Department of Marine and Fisheries or on his own private account, and if he is purchasing them on behalf of the Department of Marine and Fisheries, it is proper to have an employee of that Department holding meetings of the F.P.U.

Mr. Moore—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister, in the absence of Hon. the Minister of Marine and Fisheries:—
(a) What are the figures that are being paid G. M. Barr and the Imperial Oil Company for kerosene oil and gasoline supplied to the Department during this year.
(b) Were these prices before or since the recent reduction in duties on kerosene and gasoline.
(c) If they were, does the Department get a reduction of an equal amount, and if not, why not, and
(d) who has supplied kerosene and gasoline to the Department last year and at what figures.

Mr. Macdonnell—To ask Hon. the Minister Education:—
(1) Is the programme for the Normal School, as outlined by Hon. the Prime Minister this afternoon, the same as it was when the vote of \$100,000 for it passed this House.

(2) Have there since been any disagreements between the Government and those who agreed with the Government at that time regarding the operation of the Normal School, if so, what were they.

(3) How many pupils are now in attendance at the Normal School.

Mr. Macdonnell—To ask Hon. the Minister of Marine and Fisheries if it is the intention of the Government to provide for supervision or inspection of the Lobster Fishery during the present year.

Mr. Walsh—To ask Hon. the Prime Minister:—

(a) If the Government have been giving any consideration to the petition of the twenty thousand voters, who have asked for an amendment to the Prohibition Laws, as now in force in Newfoundland.

(b) Is the Government, as a government, satisfied that no amendment is necessary.

(c) If the Government is not satisfied with conditions as they exist, in reference to the working of the Prohibition Act, is it the intention of the Government, at the present session, to introduce legislation dealing with the matter.

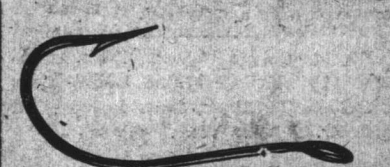

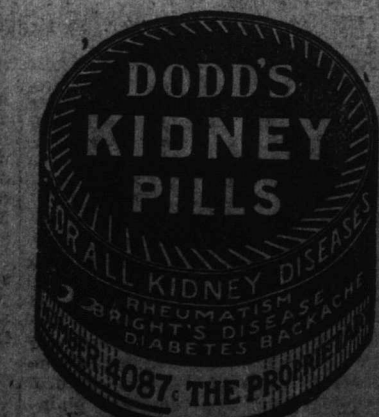
