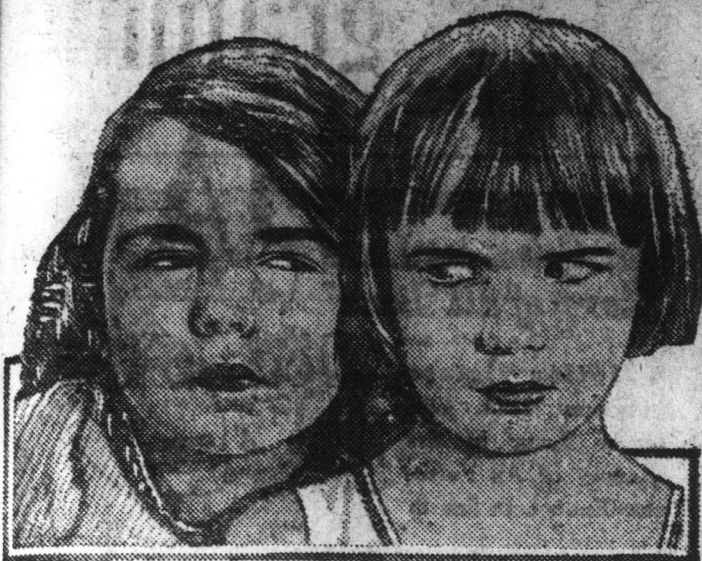

Heavy Run of River Salmon

KEEPS CANADIAN FISHERS BUSY.

VICTORIA, B.C., Sept. 18.—(A.P.)—The salmon run in British Columbia rivers is the largest since the record of 1919, according to reports received by Hon. William Sloan, provincial commissioner of fisheries. Canaries along the Fraser, Skeena and Neas rivers are working day and night shifts in an effort to take care of the catch.

The catch of sockeye, Mr. Sloan said, will be the heaviest in years. The marked increase in quantity this year will mean greater prosperity for the salmon industry.

The total value of the fisheries production of Canada was \$42,565,545 last year, according to the annual report, or an increase in value of \$755,885 over 1923.

The amount of capital represented in fishing vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers, and wharves employed in catching and landing the fish in 1923 was \$23,646,316. The number of men employed in these operations was 58,617.
