"If," asks a well-known citizen, "our City Council enacts laws, why are they not carried out? There is a law regulating the street boulevards, which is not enforced. Property owners are allowed a portion of the street, which can be fenced in by a low iron fence. In some places, especially on the street corners, there is planted cedar hedges. In some cases they are from six to eight feet in height and from three to four feet wide, completely shutting out the view and close to the sidewalks of residence to rear of them. In most cases they run along the side of a corner lot. This is a good law, and should be strictly enforced. The only use of the hedge is to shelter the tramp or a hiding place for the dangerous characters at night, out of sight of our police.
