Too Many Children.

In the course of today's discussion Dr. Merchant of the Ontario department of education said the chief reason for the fact that the teachers of this province had not a wider sphere for their work was that they had too many children to handle. That was a problem for the trustees to take up. He also appealed to them to consider the problem of looking after the boy after he had reached the age of 14. Newspaper Reports His Conversation With Viscount

CAIRO. Saturday, Jan. 3.—(By the Associated Press).—A conversation between Viscount Milner, special British commissioner, with the Grand Mufti of Egypt, who is the religious chief of the Modammedans in Egypt, is reported in the newspaper E I Misr, in which the Grand Mufti attributed the present troubled spirit to the country's disappointed expectation regarding its independence. Lord Milner contended that a protectorate was necessary to Egypt's interests and that a discussion could settle nine of ten disputed points.

Muftl Replies.

The mufti replied that no Egyptian would enter into a discussion except on the basis of independence. Lord Milner maintained that some Egyptians were willing to discuss the subject, but fear deterred them.

"Every country has its traitors. But any patriot would refuse to enter into such a discussion."
