

HELPING THE HELPLESS.

Annual Meeting of the Home for Incapacitated Two New Wings... The eleventh annual meeting of the Home for Incapacitated was held in the institution at Parkdale yesterday, Mayor Manning in the chair.

Among those present were Rev. Messrs. Parsons, D. J. Macdonnell, Dr. Ross, S. J. Hunter, Dyon Hagar, Dr. Castle, Supt. Messrs. J. P. McLeod, R. P. McKay and Messrs. Wm. Goodenham, Wm. Galbraith, R. Kilgus and many others. There were fully a hundred ladies present and the greatest interest was taken in the proceedings.

The eleventh annual report was read by the secretary. The number of patients at present in the home is 57, 26 males and 31 females; 19 were admitted during the year. Of these 3 left of their own accord and 1 was taken out by friends, while 3 died. The board were obliged during the year to give admission to many suffering from cancerous and other diseases. Two new wings are required, one of which will be devoted solely to the care of patients of the 55,000 required for the erection of these additions \$3446 has been subscribed, and it is confidently expected that the whole sum will be raised in time.

Thanks were tendered to Miss Wynne of Parkdale for a donation of \$100; to the Dental Association for a like amount; to Mrs. J. H. Mackenzie of Dundas for \$50; one of the patients, Mrs. Pridden, who died there, left the institution \$100, and Mrs. J. H. Mackenzie, who had, whose son died in the home, donated \$100. The board is greatly indebted to the ladies and gentlemen who got up the entertainment in the Grand Opera House by which the sum of \$600 was added to the funds of the home. Portraits of the late Mr. Michie and Capt. Dick have also been presented. Mr. Goodenham had contributed an invalid chair. A piano has also been obtained through the efforts of Mrs. L. H. Mackenzie.

The treasurer's report showed the total receipts from all sources on account of ordinary income and expenditures for the year ending on the 31st of December, 1884, to be \$10,131.10, and the disbursements \$8,169.13, leaving a balance on hand of \$2,326.15. The mayor apologized for the absence of himself and Mr. J. H. Mackenzie, and Mr. J. H. Mackenzie, who had been elected, was unable to attend. The old board of management, with one or two exceptions, were re-elected. After some changes in the constitution proposed by Rev. E. M. Parsons had been ordered, and the adoption of a number of resolutions relating to the property of the institution, the meeting closed with prayer.

The institution itself is a model one, in a model manner, and a walk through the wards showed that the patients without exception were well attended to, and as happy as they could be expected to be under the unfavorable circumstances.
