U. S. Ports Blockaded With Our Grain High Prices as Compared With Last Year-Local Stocks Dull-Local and Foreign Grain and Produce Markets

Business Embarrassments.

The barley situation continues to absorb much of the attention of grain men, especially those lealing directly in it. Strenuous efforts are being made to get as much as possible into the Justed States before the McKinley bill comes into peration. Col. Parsons of Rochester, the well-known barley dealer there, was in town yesterlay. He states that the ports of Charlotte, Oswego and Buffalo are blockaded with Canadian barley, and he estimates that before Oct. 6,000,000 bushels will have entered the Justed States. A prominent local barley dealer says that even if the McKinley bill takes 20 cents a bushel off the present prices the position of the barley grower will not be untavorable as compared with that of last year. Out of a probable 7,000,000 bushels will have gone to the United States before Oct. 6th at an average price to farmers of 85 cents. The average price paid last year was 40 cents, according to the estimate of a well-known barley house. Even with a diminution of 20 cents a bushel, if researt prices rule, the grower will get 5 cents a bushel more than he did last year. 
