At the meeting of the Trades and Labor Gouncil last evening in Central Labor Hall T. W. Banton occupied the chair.

The names of Delegates Lawrence and Herwood were added, respectively, to the municipal and education committees.

In the racemendations of the Educational Commissee were the following classes "Children should be educated Lysically to insure the mental vigor necessay" to pursue studies, as well as for the effect it has on future generations."

"Anything that will interfere with the full and free exercise of their reason, or the carrying out of the action suggested by their reason, we consider a permicious obstruction, and for this reason we urge upon all whose aim is intelligence and reform, necessarily attainable only by intelligence, to demand purely secular education."

"We believe that all education is not subject to material boundaries, but what we do insis upon is that no foundation for religious creeds be tolerated in any school supporter may be."

The committee also expressed the hope that when the Public School Board next awarded coptracts they would first ascertain whether those furnishing estimates paid union wages. They regretted that Gage & Co. had seculed the School book contract.

They were pleased to note that the Trades and Labor Congress passed resolutions calling on the different governments to establish printing and binding bureaus and for the payment of a recognized scale of wages in all public contracts.

Against the City.

The Chancery Divisional Court yesterday delivered judgment in the action of Mun row. Fulton, dismissing the appeal and affirming the judgment of Mr. Justice Falconbridge, who tried the action at St. Thomas. The defendant is a physician at St. Thomas, and was sued for majpractice. At the trial the plaintiff was non-suited and he appealed to the Divisional Court.

Judgment was also delivered in the cases of Tiffany v. McNee and Metcalf v. McNee, dismissing the appeals. The defendant, a publisher of a newspaper, printed an account of the trial of a libel action while being tried, and made comment on the case which, it was claimed, prejudiced the trial, and for this he himself was sued for libel. Judgment was given against him, and he appealed to the Divisional Court.

Mr. Justice Street made an order postponing the trial of the East Simcee election petition from Oct. 3 till Dec. 15 at Barrie.

M. & J. L. Vokes are suing the city for \$1000 damages, and Thomas Murray is suing for \$200 damages for injuries to goods and premises caused by alleged defective sewers. Before Chief Justice Galt an application was made to commit the defendant in the action of Verral v. Walsh for non-compliance with an order to remove a stable from her property in Stafford-street, near the plaintiff's houses. Judgment was reserved. Chief Justice Galt also made an order, on the application of Carter & Co., restraining and selling counter check books, by which the plaintiff's claim their patent for check books it infringed. The injunction restrains the defendants from manufacturing and selling check books till the matters in dispute between the two parties are settled by trial.


