SHOULD COUNCIL INTERFERE?

DISCUSSION ON THE HOTEL LICENSES FOR THE ISLAND.

City Solicitor Will Report on Legality of Appealing to License Commissioners—Factory on Banks of the Don—Cobban Application Re-considered—To Improve the Coast of New Island.

The Executive Committee of the City Council dispatched a large amount of business yesterday. The many pavements and sidewalks sanctioned by the Board of Works were adopted.

The Property Committee's recommendation that the Cobban Manufacturing Co. be offered a lease of Esplanade property in Lake-street at the rate of \$4.50 per foot for 21 years, carried.

The Property Committee was given authority to proceed with the arbitration to determine the amounts to be paid for improvements on the Island lot of R. Boswell, Q.C., upon which houses have been erected. The city declines to renew the lease.

Telephone service with Centre Island will be opened as soon as the poles are erected.

New Factory on the Don Flats. The Manufacturers' Committee sent the application of the Kemp Manufacturing Co. for a lease of a site on the Don improvement, upon which to erect their new enamelled iron and steel works, the first of the kind in Canada. These were the terms proposed by the Executive.

A strip of land on the west bank, extending from the north side of the street northward to a point 350 feet distant, and to the easterly limit of the old Don channel, the lease to extend to a period of 21 years, the rental to be for the first ten years 90 cents per foot frontage, and for the balance of the term of the lease \$1.00 per foot frontage, the company to be exempt from taxation on the land and buildings.

The Island Hotel license. The Manufacturers' Committee sent the application of the Kemp Manufacturing Co. for a lease of a site on the Don improvement, upon which to erect their new enamelled iron and steel works, the first of the kind in Canada. These were the terms proposed by the Executive.

On the reading of J. J. MacLaren's letter, asking the council to take further steps to prevent summer hotel licenses being granted to the Toronto Ferry Co., Ald. MacLaren reiterated that the council had no right to interfere with the action of the License Commissioners. The argument would hold the same if the application came from the Ontario Hotel-keepers as now from the temperance party.

Ald. Frankland concurred, and said the temperance party ought to be satisfied with the views which had already been expressed by the council.

Mr. Lockhart Gordon admitted that the petition for the hotel license was signed by a majority of the council, and that the signatures and application came too late.

Ald. MacLaren: The Ontario Government made the law, and the Ontario Government should see that the law is carried out. Mr. MacLaren's application is outside the duty of this council. The proceedings asked may involve the city in a law suit, and we have no right to go to law and spend the taxpayers' money either for licensed victuallers or for temperance people.

Chairman Shaw: And we have no right to assume that the License Commissioners are going to do wrong. Such a suggestion ought not to be made.

It was unanimously agreed to ask the City Solicitor to report on the legality of the council complying with the request of the temperance people, and further if the Executive Committee has power to spend the taxpayers' money in such a case.
