The Manufacturers' Committee sent on the application of the Kemp Manufac-turing Co. for a lease of a site on the turing Co. for a lease of a site on the Don improvement, upon which to erect their new enamelled iron and steel works, the first of the kind in Canada. These were the terms passed by the Executive. A strip of land on the west bank, extending from the north side of Gerrard-street northerly to a point 350 feet distance, and to the easterly limit of the old Don channel; the lease to extend to a period of 21 years; the rental to be for the first ten years 90 cents per foot frontage, and for the balance of the term of the lease \$1.50 per foot frontage, the company to be exempt from taxation on the land and buildings.
