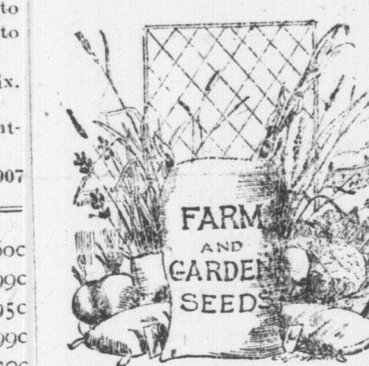

### NEW PAPER MILL FOR NOVA SCOTIA.

(Halifax Herald.)  
A new paper mill is nearly com-  
pleted to be operated in connection  
with the pulp mills located at Milton  
Falls, five miles above Liverpool.  
The pulp mills there have been in  
operation for a number of years un-  
der the management of John S.  
Hughes. They have been very suc-  
cessful. A new corporation consisting  
of Halifax and Liverpool parties are  
purchasing the entire property with  
timber lands and water power. The  
branch of the B. & N. S. W. railway  
now being constructed from Liverpool  
to the yards of the mills will greatly  
reduce the cost of handling wood as  
well as the manufactured goods. The  
tendency of wood pulp generally is  
upward, and the market is ample  
both in Great Britain and United  
States. The prospects of the new com-  
pany are therefore very encouraging.  
The output of the pulp mills is about  
eight thousand tons per annum, and  
the capacity of the paper mill two  
thousand tons.

### GEORGIAN BAY CANAL.

The building of this great water-  
way has been a vexed political ques-  
tion for fifty years. The present gov-  
ernment has been systematically mak-  
ing surveys, and acquiring informa-  
tion which would tend to a final solu-  
tion of all the problems presented in a  
scheme of such magnitude as the  
building of this canal.  
The report of the Georgian Bay  
Canal Commissioners will be pre-  
sented to the House next session. It  
will contain full detailed particulars  
as to the completed cost of the entire  
waterway—four hundred and sixty  
miles in length. Nearly six hundred  
thousand dollars have been expended  
in securing for the first time full and  
accurate data with respect to the  
cost of the great project.

The total cost of the canal, it is es-  
timated, will reach one hundred and  
five million dollars. The report will  
deal not only with the estimated cost,  
but will explain the engineering prob-  
lems to be encountered in the con-  
struction. The figures cover a route  
from the Georgian Bay to Montreal,  
via the French River, Lake Nipissing,  
and the Ottawa River.  
The report will show that the plan  
is quite feasible, the only point to be  
decided is as to whether the expected  
results will justify such an expendi-  
ture of public money. It is expected  
that the canal will have a continuous  
depth of twenty-one feet during the  
period of navigation. Sir Wilfrid  
Laurier while in England recently ex-  
pressed himself as in favor of the  
construction of this canal.

### THAT YEAR WITHOUT A SUMMER.

A week or two ago The Times pub-  
lished an article from an old member  
of the New Sun which stated that  
there was no summer in the year 1816.  
The truth of the article was question-  
ed here by many people, but the fol-  
lowing interesting facts can be found  
in Rev. Dr. Patterson's "History of  
the County of Pictou, N. S." published  
in 1877.

"In the Northern States frost, ice  
and snow were common in June. Snow  
fell to the depth of ten inches in Ver-  
mont, seven in Maine and three in  
Central New York. On the 5th of July  
ice was formed of the thickness of  
common window glass throughout  
New England. New York and some  
parts of Pennsylvania. In August ice  
was formed half an inch thick. Indian  
corn was so frozen that the greater  
part was cut down for fodder. Indeed  
hurdled in with. The region is very  
fertile, harvests of wheat, oats, and  
other cereals are constant and good.  
They are said to equal in quality and  
quantity the harvests per acre of  
Manitoba or Saskatchewan.

The warm currents from the Pacific  
cross the mountain and find their  
way down the mountain passes and  
maintain a fairly even temperature.  
The district is said to be rich in mineral,  
but so far the pursuits have been  
agricultural.
