A good deal of activity has prevailed in some departments of trade during the week, owing to the preparations for distrect which are now being made. In groceries the sales have been moderately large; and in agricultural implements a good trade has been done.

The weather of the week has been very favorable to fall and spring crops, and the various accounts from the country at hand lead to the conviction that we are about to be blessed with an abundant harvest. For haying, which has just commenced, the weather has been indications that the weather will be more favorable.

In produce, little has been done, farmers being too busy in the lay-field to come to market.

Flour market. The small stock on hand, and the probability of a small supply until after harvest, rastricts meristices, and there has been no pressure to sell. Had there been much of a desire manifested to sell, the market would have given way, owing to the unfavourable advices but the small stock has kept the market up, and it appears to be firm, with a tendency, in neither direction. For Superfine, \$1 15 to \$1 20, is the current price, and we note a small sale at the latter rate, free on band. Fanc, is scarce, and is not much in demand, at \$5 40 to \$5 60. If a trail is not much in demand at \$6 00 to \$6 20, are the prices demanded. Double Extra is sold at \$6 50, but favorite brands are held at \$7 00 per barrel.

Oameral can be had at \$4 00 per barrel, but barrel

DATMEAL can be had at \$4.00 per barrel, but holders demand \$4.10 to \$4.25 per barrel. Commercial kiln dried, \$2.00 to \$3.125 per barrel. Whear is lardly so active as at the date of our last. The small quantity brought in by farmers has been unsufficient to interest buyers, and neither the amply nor demand is as good as during the season. The best price paid was \$1.25 to \$1.30 was paid, and the average price for the day was about \$1.25 per bushel. The quality was very good, and last year's crops to the end has turned out well.

For Spring wheat there is a moderate enquiry, but there is so little offering that the market is harlly tested. We quote good grades at \$1.10 to \$1.12 per bushel, and medium lote at \$1.05 to \$1.06.

POTATORS.—Old potatoes are plentiful and duli of sale at 20c to 250 per bushel.

Fautr.—Farmers fruit is beginning to offer freely at 50 to 70 per quart for cherries; 50 to 60 for conselection, and 80 for black, and 80 to 100 for conselection are quart

BUTKE.—Although plentiful, fresh butter commands slightly better rates, 12) to 15c is a common rate, and choice lots have been sold from the waggons at higher figures, say 16c and 17c. For wholesale, tub butter is more firm at loss to 11c for new No. 1, and a very prime lot might bring 12c per lb. No. 2 and old butter is plentiful and dull at 8c.
