of that humble Negro preacher, and say which of the two illustrates the divine power with more unquestionable certainty of demonstration, Tyndal, the scientist, or Steward, the evar gelist?

THE following private prayers are recommended by the "Church Service Society" to be said privately by each worshipper:

AT ENTERING CHURCH.

O send out Thy light and Thy truth: let them lead me: let them bring me unto Thy holy hill, and to Thy tabernacles. Amen.

Or this,

Merciful God, pour Thy Holy Spirit on Thy Ministers and Thy worshipping people everywhere: And Thou, Blessed Saviour, who hast promised to be present in the assembling of two or three of Thy people, remember this word unto Thy servant, upon which Thou hast caused me to hope. Amen.

(2.) AT THE CLOSE OF DIVINE SERVICE.

Give me Thy Holy Spirit: Deepen every good impression: Strengthen every holy purpose: Accept that which was sincere in my worship; and pardon the much unworthiness: for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.
