Provincial Parliament.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.
REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS.
Wednesday, May 29.
The House met at 3 o'clock.

Mr. Solicitor General McDonald, (Glengarry), was introduced by Messrs. Baldwin and Hincks, and took the oath of office.

Mr. Price delivered to the Speaker, who then read the following Message from His Excellency the Governor General:

His Excellency the Governor General informs the Honourable the Legislative Assembly that in the Month of March, 1850, and reserved for the signature of Her Majesty's pleasure, entitled, "An Act to raise an Income of one hundred thousand pounds out of the Public Lands in Canada for the support of Public Schools," was specially confirmed and finally enacted by Her Majesty in Council on the 5th of March, 1850.

Mr. Price moved to bring in a bill, for the collection of Taxes in Upper Canada; second reading, that day.

Mr. Hincks introduced and moved a bill to alter the current value of certain Foreign Coins. Bill read a first time.

Mr. Christie enquired of the Ministry whether they intended bringing in any measure for the relief of the Gaspe Fisheries.

Mr. Hincks replied that he was not prepared with any such measure at present.

Mr. Burritt introduced a bill to alter the practice of the Law in actions of Dower in Upper Canada; second reading Wednesday next.

Mr. Price moved to amend the practice and proceedings in actions of Ejectment in Upper Canada; second reading Wednesday next.

Mr. Cameron, (Cornwall), introduced a bill to amend an Act, entitled, "An Act to compel Vessels to carry a Light during the night, and to make sundry provisions to regulate the Navigation of the Waters of this Province," second reading 6th June next.
