- a) execution of the request would require
 the requested State to exceed its legal
 authority or would otherwise be
 prohibited by legal provisions in force
 in that State, or when the information
 requested is not obtainable under the
 laws or in the normal course of the
 administration of the requested State or
 of the other Contracting State, in which
 case the competent authorities of both
 Contracting States shall consult with
 each other to agree upon alternative
 lawful means for securing assistance;
 - b) execution of the request would in the judgement of the requested State be contrary to its national security or public policy;
 - to supply information would disclose any trade, business, industrial, commercial, or professional secret or trade process;
 - d) execution of the request would impose on a Contracting State the obligation to carry out measures at variance with the laws or the administrative practices of that or the other Contracting State; or
 - e) the request does not comply with the provisions of this Convention.
- 4. The Contracting States shall provide assistance through exchanges of information authorized pursuant to
