Since its inception, what was the total amount loaned by CMHC for the construction of single family houses and, of this amount, how much has been paid back?

Hon. Ron Basford (Minister of State for Urban Affairs): I am advised by Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation as follows: Since 1946, CMHC has made loans totalling \$3.9 billion to assist in financing the construction of single-family houses in Canada. It is not possible to provide information on the amount repaid, since the accounting records of CMHC do not differentiate among the various types of structure.
