

To produce any effect at all the treatment must not be too short for there is a point below which the ra-dium seems to have no influence upon the plant whatever. Nor may the treatment be too prolonged, for in that case the plant seems to be injured. These results are similar to those ob-tained in experiments made to find whether and to what extent the winter buds can be forced by ether vapor and b ywarm water. Similar positive results were ob-tained with several other plants, such as the chestnut, the fulip tree, the Norway maple and others. Some plants, however, remained indifferent to the treatment; among these were the gluko, or Japanese "maidenhain-fern pine tree." the plane tree, the heech and the lime. The beech and the lime also failed to give results when treated with ether and with warm water.
