In the Settlement of our old Colonies, proper Cautions were not taken to prevent the Monopoly of large Tracts of Land, which are still engrossed by a few rich People of Jamaica, as well as in the Provinces of Virginia, New-York, Carolina, New-England, &c. This is the only Cause why that Island is not well peopled at this Day. The Northern Colonies above mentioned are under the like Difadvantage, for the same Reason; particularly towards the Boundaries most remote from the Those Lands which are thus reserved by monopolizing Grantees, or their Successors, for the Profit of a future Sale, cannot be purchased by poor Settlers at an exorbitant Price, who would gladly cultivate them, if they might do fo upon reasonable Terms: And thus, for want of Occupants the French have made, and are still making, Encroachments upon the Back of all those Colonies.

For this growing Evil there are but two Remedies practicable; confishently with Justice, and the Constitution of a free Government. The first and most obvious is, by laying an high Tax upon every uncultivated Acre of Land, by the Legislature of each Colony. Such a Tax may contribute to the Support of Government, instead of other heavy Imposts upon
