Launch Lines Going On Porcupine Lake

Public Will Be Afforded Ample Transportation in the Mining Camp.

PORCUPINE CITY, May 15.—(From Our Man Up North).—That the public, when visiting the mining camp this summer, will be well served in the transportation line is evidenced by the fact that two well-known Porcupine residents have established boat lines on Porcupine Lake; Robble-Morrison, with the Pathfinder, a deep sea boat, and "Butch" Burns, with the Alice, a craft of high traveling power. Conditions in the camp are such that it becomes necessary in order to keep the rate of the truck and to use ferry boats in crossing from Golden City to Porcupine City, and also from the north end of the lake to the south end. The Alice and the Pathfinder are on the lake regularly and not much time is consumed in making the long trips. The safest and only way to travel in the Porcupine camp is by boat.

BULLION SHIPMENTS.

COBALT, May 20.—Another shipment of bullion left Cobalt this week, the Nipissing mine shipping 47 bars, valued at \$23,835. The record for this week is 23,835 ounces, value \$6,834. The other mines contributing to the shipment are the O'Brien and the Timiskaming. It will be noticed that the Nipissing mine now heads the list as regards both gold and bullion shipments, the quantity of bullion shipped this week being 23,835 ounces, value \$6,834.

Porcupine Cleans Up Many Men at Work

Water Recedes Gradually and Camp is in Throes of Thoro Spring Overhauling.

PORCUPINE CITY, May 15.—(From Our Man Up North).—With the water receding slowly and roads at the north and west sides of the lake still covered with a foot of water, residents of the south and north end towns are rushing the work of town improvements, the cleaning and clearing of the streets, drainage of lots into the street ditches, and laying blocks of board walk.

In the south end 100 men are at work making the town clean and healthy and laying walks on all the main streets. At the north end of the lake Golden City, the most easterly town in the Porcupine camp, has an advantage, for here the government are interested and \$1000 in improvements are being spent to complete a drainage system and clean and clear streets. The Vane townsite are also laying railway station site.

Drainage and cutting out streets are also under way on the new Porcupine City townsite on the McGregor veteran lot.
