SIDE LIGHT ON QUEBEC TAX MERCHANTS ARE SUFFERERS

Middle and Smaller Classes Will Feel Ban on Commercial Travelers.

From a prohibitive standpoint, the ax of \$300 on travelers from abroad and agents living in Canada, other than Quebec Province, affects the middle and smaller merchant more than appears on the surface, and will not in the end be likely to enrich the Quebec treasury as much as Mr. Corkill, provincial treasurer, calculates," said a well-known commercial traveler yesterday, "It will rather impoverish it," he continued. "Outside of all the quesons brought up by the different boards of trade that it is a gross interference in this Dominion with trade and com-merce comes the fact that it will eventually force the smaller merchant out of business and the middle merchant, with much ability and perhaps more money, to add considerably to the annual expense of his business and

"The small merchant has had for the past years the privilege of buying his goods as he thinks best as to values. The middle merchant has enjoyed the same. Considering that a traveler or agent is forced to abandon falling on these merchants because his firm refuses to pay this tax, and he cannot take the risk of being caught selling goods in the province without a license, this, then, compels the small merchant to buy his goods from local wholesale houses, unless he goes outside the province to buy his goods by appointment, which very much interferes with his

Must Send Abroad. The middle merchant does not find established, and on a good financial basis. All the same he is forced to send buyers abroad to buy goods which he never has had to do before, simply because, perhaps, one buyer has in the past gone abroad buying many varieties of goods, and the other lines bought at home from travelers, but he now adds expense to his business to compete with the larger houses in sending additional buyers to foreign
