LEGISLATURE DISCUSS FIGHTING WHITE PLAGUE

L. P. Downey Moves Second Reading of His Bill—Board of Health Prepared to Act.

Premier Whitney, in view of the desire to close the session by Easter, moved in the legislature yesterday that, as under the rules government business cannot be dealt with on Monday, if the opposition had no objection, an opportunity would be given to take up government business on Monday after other business had been disposed of.

Hon. Mr. Graham realized the necessity if the intention was to get through by the time announced, but thought better not to sit that afternoon. It would be members' own fault if they were not present in the future.

The motion carried.

Premier Whitney stated that he would announce to-day his suggestion for dealing with the various amendments to the Assessment Act, so as to avoid embarrassing the house by dealing with them separately. There are 13 bills of this nature down for second reading. There are 27 amending the Municipal Act.

Tuberculosis Prevention.

J. P. Downey moved the second reading of the bill to prevent the spread of tuberculosis, made an excellent speech, well supported by statistics, reasonable and impressive in tone and commendable in brief. Provincial Secretary Hanna once more put the issue over and Mr. Downey consented to the withdrawal of his bill on the understanding, however, that it would be referred to the provincial board of health, with a view to definite action being taken by the government next session. This is looked upon as a pledge that the government will really deal with one of the most important questions before the province, and which involves more in the loss of life, not to speak of money, than any other cause outside the liquor question.

Mr. Downey's bill provided for the establishment of county sanitaria and the compulsory reporting of all tuberculosis cases. Mr. Downey said that until Dr. Koch's discoveries, science had no clear method of proceeding against the disease. There was always the difficulty of deciding how far we should go in interfering with individual liberty. There was a secretiveness for material reasons among families whose members might be stricken by the disease, which difficultly of decision was smallpox and other infectious diseases. Physicians of the time of Aristotle, Galen, Caperdus and other doctors from the dark ages downwards were quoted by the member for Quebec as showing the necessity of precautions against its infectious character. Cholin, the musician, was shunned on this account and Chateaubriand, writing from Rome, narrated his distress because that city had quarantined it.

The deaths annually over the world from consumption are 500,000. In England and Wales there are 60,000 deaths a year. London has 10,000 deaths from it, and the United States 120,000. Germany has 134,000 deaths of children directly or indirectly owing to tuberculosis. In the United States, Stevenson and other men of genius were mentioned by Mr. Downey as victims of the disease. The enormous cost he illustrated by figures presented at a recent German congress running up to \$100,000,000.

into hundreds of millions annually. Measures to Alleviate.

As a result of educative measures adopted in Germany in connection with a workmen's insurance scheme a great reduction in the death rate had been secured. Norway took forward stand and compelled notification to the health officers of all cases of tuberculosis, who take such precautions as may be deemed necessary in isolating the cases. Large sums are spent by the States of the Union, Rhode Island having recently spent \$125,000 on a sanatorium.

Little or nothing was done in the Dominion or in Ontario. Mr. Downey cited the report presented by the Dominion committee thru Senator Edwards and Senator Perley and which led to no action. The City of Hamilton was the only municipality taking advantage of the provincial act, and had created a hospital for consumptives and was receiving the grant for that purpose.

The death rate in Ontario had risen from 1948 in 1871, or 75 per 1000 to 130 per 1000 in 1904. The County of Waterloo was lowest in this respect. The average rate was observed along the St. Lawrence of 1.83, Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry being 2.13. The highest rate in the province was at Thunder Bay, where the rate of population increased it to 2.28.

Without compulsory notification Mr. Downey spoke with earnest eloquence of whatever might be done by the establishment of hospitals, sanatoria, dispensaries, the operation of educative measures, nothing would avail for the success of systematic and effective methods of treatment.

Criticism and Suggestions.

A. G. Mackay thought the bill was too local and too expensive in its methods to present a desirable solution of the problem. It should be dealt with by the government, and instead of 40 or more sanatoria and as many dispensaries, less would be found to be required. The officers proposed by the bill, for the county boards of health were changed too frequently for such a body. The warden, as chairman, might be changed every year. He was considerable to be said against giving a county board of health power to compel a county council to build sanatoria. These objections might be obtained by making the bill a government measure.

Hon. Mr. Hanna said all would agree that the house was greatly indebted to Mr. Downey for the manner in which he had presented the case and the bill he had put on the subject. His own short experience indicated a very rapid change of opinion as to the number of sanatoria required to take care of the disease. He had been told that a deputation representing five counties (Waterloo, Perth, etc.) submitted the present act was not properly shaped, and wished for power to unite the five counties to build one sanatorium with \$20,000 from the five, instead of five in each of the five counties.

The board of health had done a lot of work on this subject in the last six months and had drafted a plan which might readily be put in the form of a bill. It had been suggested that there should be a reorganization of local boards of health. (Opposition heard.) The local boards of health were among the best of our institutions of health, with a skilled medical man at the head. (Hear, hear.)

GRENFELL AND HIS WORK FOR PEOPLE OF LABRADOR

Doctor-Philanthropist Tells of His Plan for Stocking Reindeer.

Dr. Wilfrid Grenfell, C.M.G., the distinguished medical missionary, attracted one of the largest audiences which the Canadian Club have ever had. He held the audience in deep interest as he narrated incidents of the work on the Labrador.

He reprobated the Canadian government for its inefficient systems of communication with the scattered population on the Canadian coast of Labrador. He said the idea of introducing the deer was originated by Dr. Sheridan Jackson and Governor Brady in Alaska. Dr. Jackson introduced 1500 deer a few years ago, which had now multiplied to 12,000. Reindeer were valuable to the Labrador settlers and Indians because they would supply them with milk, and the milk products, meat in winter and their skins would make clothing for the present and future populations. Export of the reindeer would also provide employment for the settlers and winter and would prevent many of the bleeding reindeer joints and aching limbs which greet the doctor each winter. The evidence of scurvy in the homes of the weather-bound fishers and settlers. These deer live on the native mosses on the barren lands, where trees are never seen. As proof of the power of the moss to support them, Dr. Grenfell said that on the barren lands there were hundreds of thousands of caribou, and he pointed out that a dozen Indians with repeating rifles could slaughter over 100 deer in one season. One square mile of moss will support thirty reindeer in winter. It would cost \$100 a year to land these reindeer, but Harmsworth had offered to go in on equal terms, and he was hoping the Moravians would repeat their gift of reindeer. Also, and that a practical start would be made this year.

Dr. Grenfell said the Boston Transcript, which, in addition to Boston for a reprint of his articles three times what it gave him had also raised \$6000 for his reindeer fund. He advised missionaries to send their "copy" to the secular press, and he had found by experience that the missionary papers did not pay him and their readers scarcely read them.

He scorned the Christian Scientists and said medical treatment must be rational. He narrated many instances of the evils of the old truck system on the coast, and said that when he first went on the Labrador coast it was impossible to buy salt for money. The dealers wanted the fish, not cash. It was the last for the fish, and the provincial board of health, and they wanted to keep alive the system by which they made the most money, and cared not who suffered by it.

Their hospitals at Hamilton Inlet and Belle Harbor connect with civilization by Marcomgrams, and, thanks to the generosity of Strachan Johnston of Toronto, who guaranteed \$2000 a year for five years, the Marcomgrams, which gave \$2000; the Victoria Order of Nurses, who contribute a nurse and \$2000 yearly; and the Canadian Red Cross, who gave the building, they had at last a hospital on the Canadian Labrador coast. Their buildings were worth \$17,000, and they had a 10-horsepower motor boat for the doctor's service in summer, and the Marcomgrams had given him a team and sledges for winter.

Miracles were still performed. Many a blind man received his sight, and many a lame man walked again. That was the sort of Gospel they preached, and Dr. Grenfell added: "If I was a man with a broken leg, that is the sort of a gospel I'd run for."

The loudest applause was reserved for a touching story of these people's gratitude for the doctor's work. One night he had reached a little Roman Catholic village. The snow was so light he could not ride on his dog sled, but would have to walk. At midnight, while Dr. Grenfell slept, twenty-two men started out to tramp twenty-five miles to the next settlement, so that when the doctor followed at daybreak he could ride in his sleigh in comfort.

Rev. Dr. Crosby, an Alaskan missionary, was also present and made a stirring speech in support of Dr. Grenfell and the practical Christianity he practiced.
