DUNCAN MACKENZIE DEAD.

Elders Brother of William Mackenzie Passes Away at Kirkfield.

KIRKFIELD, July 2.—Duncan Mackenzie, the elder brother of William Mackenzie of the Canadian Northern Railway, died this afternoon at his residence here from heart trouble.

He was born in Montreal, Que., May 23, 1833. He leaves three sons—John, Charles and William D.—and three daughters—Mary, Melinda M. and Sarah C. He also leaves four brothers—Alexander, William, Agnes, and Harry—in Toronto, and Robert of Winnipeg—and three sisters—Mrs. John McTaggart and Mrs. C. R. Stovel of Winnipeg and Mrs. L. McFadden of Kirkfield.

The funeral will take place next Friday from the residence to Lakeview Cemetery here.

HAMILTON, July 2.—(Special.)—The board of works this evening received two tenders for the street lighting contract to be from July 1, 1908, not counting the tender that is being prepared by the Hydro-Electric Power Company. One company wrote that it had not had time to prepare a tender, and it was agreed to extend the time for a month. Tenders for gas boulevard lamps will also be asked.

The MacDonald monument will be removed to the east end of the Gore extension, if the finance committee votes \$450. The committee will not object to the double tracking of Main-street, from James-street to the terminal station, until the Cataract companies give a statement of the agreement amongst the various companies that will use the tracks. Aid. McLaren found fault because East and West Avenues, Wellington-street and Wellington-street to the west had been paved without the authority of the board. He said that if it occurred again he would see that the person who authorized such work paid for it. The street railway asked for permission to use the rails that are being removed from East King-street to repair Herkimont-street, between Lock and Queen-streets. This will not be granted until City Engineer Barrow makes report.

The Hamilton presbytery today granted the Sherman-avenue Presbyterians permission to borrow \$10,000 for a new church. The congregation wanted an \$18,000 building. They must raise \$8000 before starting. Rev. James Anthony Macdonald, was selected moderator. Calls to Rev. W. S. Wright, from St. Anne's and Wellandport, and to Rev. A. L. Howard, Cayuga, from Kenora and Oxford Mills were sustained. Rev. James Gourlay, Dunnville, sent in his resignation.

John Patterson has sold the property of the Ontario Nickel-Copper Company for \$1,000,000.

The Retail Merchants' Association opened a three days' convention in the Conservatory of Music this morning. The grocers' section decided to endorse the movement started by the Toronto branch to secure a government standard of purity for foods. They also want legislation fixing the weight of a loaf of bread and fixing the weight of a bag of potatoes at 90 pounds. They decided to ask for a larger duty on eggs, the inspection of canned goods for home consumption, and the appointment of fruit inspectors at Toronto and Montreal as an experiment. The following officers were elected: M. J. Trevelyan, Toronto, chairman; J. E. Ford, Ottawa, and J. O. Carpenter, Hamilton, vice-chairman; T. Nappy, Toronto, treasurer; R. E. Mowbray, Toronto, secretary.

TWO CHARGES AGAINST KIELY

Inquiry Will Be Made Into Dealings of St. Boniface Superintendent.

WINNIPEG, Man., July 2.—(Special.)—Two informations have been laid against W. J. Kiely, superintendent of construction at St. Boniface, on alleged irregularities in connection with employment of a mythical person, called Philip Rice, and the mysterious disappearance of twelve sacks of cement.

The transactions involve \$147,700 in the first instance, and in the second \$12,785.

Kiely appeared in court this morning, but the case was enlarged till Saturday.

Another charge of alleged irregularities in regard to sale of cordwood, it is believed, will be preferred.
