WHEAT'S STILL TUMBLING.

Yellow Fever Brings Provision Prices Down. Corn Strong-Features of the Grain and Food Markets During the Week Ending To-day - Quotations, Gen. Notes, Etc.

Those who expected last week's heavy drop in wheat to be followed by a reaction for the better have been disappointed. For the price of the cereal has all this week been steadily on the decline. The European heavy wheat shipments, which have been much more than enough to supply Europe's current requirements, and the announcement that on Monday last there was sufficient wheat to fill the American's estimated need for six weeks to come, had a depressing effect on the market. Above all, however, in bullish effect are the growing crop reports of the United States and Canada, of which places the coming yield at 77,000,000 bushels, or 140,000,000 more than the previous year's crop.
