London, Jan. 10.—At a local banquet given in Johannesburg last night Lord Milner, the British High Commissioner in South Africa, made a long speech on the situation, and expressed his belief that the storm cloud overhanging Africa had burst, that the great crisis was now behind instead of before, and that men breathed more freely.

After strongly denouncing the tactics of the British pro-Boers, Lord Milner declared: "The war will end all the sooner if we apply a steady physical pressure without relaxing about the least."
