There is a constantly good demand, however, for wheat, which is felt more in the Manitobal Duluth and Kansas hard wheat than our No. 1 Nor. so far. Primary receipts are small, and, with liberal foreign demand, stocks would decrease rapidly. On the bulges we favor sales of September wheat. Corn has had weak undertone during most of session, altho there has been some affectuar cash enquiry, and some yellow corn has been sold at full prices. The promised warm weather and near approach to delivery day in May has tendency to weaken values more than ordinary, because of liberal stocks of contract corn here and small premium of July.

Oats have, shown some weakness, with small trade. Cash demand rather poor. Some complaints from country of crop not doing well.
