Carriage Workers Receive First Strike Pay—G.T.R. Firemen Want a New Schedule.

The Bakers and Confectioners' Union met on Saturday night and accepted the compromise decided upon by a committee and representatives of the employer who discussed the wage and working hour question.

There are still 100 architectural and structural iron workers out on strike. They remain in Richmond Hill to discuss the situation.

The Grand Trunk Railway men will submit a schedule of wages to the company three months' notice.

JUDGE ORDERS THAT PRISONERS BE THERE ON TUESDAY.

Quebec, May 18.—Donald MacMaster, King's Counsel, came here from Montreal to-day, representing Detective Carpentier, who arrested the fugitive and Capt. Greene, who are wanted in the United States for conspiracy to defraud the government.

The judge asked if the defence would give assurance that advantage would not be taken of the delay in rushing thru the extradition proceedings.

The judge finally ordered that the writ must be obeyed by Carpentier by 10 o'clock on Tuesday morning. If Gaynor and Greene are not then produced here Carpentier will go to jail.
