The World's informant indignantly declares that a railway cannot cancel a pass which is authorized by act of parliament, nor can it impose the conditions governing accident and loss of property. It is possible that these passes have been issued only for the time intervening between the beginning of the New Year and Feb. 1, when the Railway Act will be proclaimed. After that date it is suggested a pass may be issued that will be more in keeping with the act of parliament, which requires the railways to grant free transportation to members.
