

**MILITARY HONORS
PAID IN FUNERAL
OF YOUNG FLIER**

Cadet Wilfred H. Winnett

The funeral of Cadet Wilfred Henry Winnett, Royal Air Force, who died in hospital at Camp Borden on Monday night, as a result of injuries received in an airplane accident, was held from the residence of his parents.

The funeral was of a military nature, a firing squad being furnished by the 1st Battalion, Canadian Garrison Regiment, which was accompanied by the chaplain, assisted Dr. Peever in the services, and interment was made at Mount Pleasant. The deceased and mourners were six members of the Canadian Garrison Regiment, and the last to leave the church was the late Cadet Winnett. The son of T. B. Winnett, formerly of this city and now of Montreal, and both he and his brother, Cadet J. B. Winnett, are up excellent positions to come and enter the Canadian Forces. The latter is now in Toronto, and the former is in London.

Relative in this city are: Mrs. Cox, William street, who is an aunt; Charles and Richard Winnett, uncles, while Tecumseh House, former owner of the Queen's Hotel, Toronto, and Dr. Winnett of Toronto, are uncles.

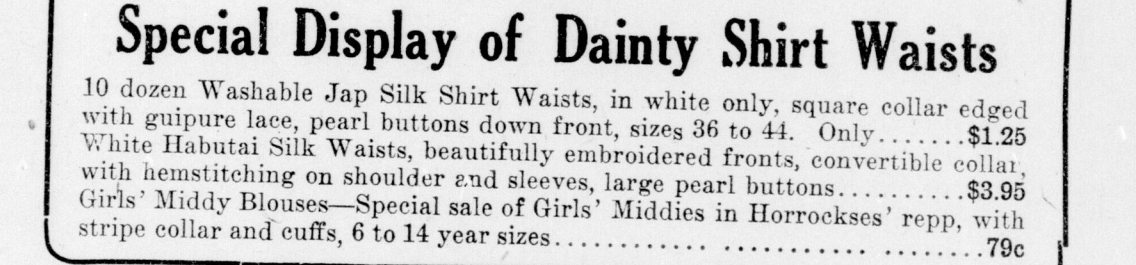
