HEALTH BOARD TOLD OF EXCELLENT WORK OF ST. JOHN NURSES

Hundreds of Cases Were Handled by Division Staff.

According to a report on the work done during the influenza epidemic by St. John Ambulance Nursing Division, which was read by Mrs. J. F. Thomson to the board of health at its meeting yesterday afternoon, about 1,000 cases were treated by the nursing division during the epidemic. were treated by the nursing division during the epidemic.

Excluding those at the Children's Shelter, between 500 and 600 cases were attended outside of the two hospitals. On October 1 the first call for aid was sent to the division. They had two beds at the time, but W. S. Lashbrook, proprietor of the Belvedere Hotel, came to the rescue and provided them with beds.

to the rescue and provided them with beds.

On October 19 Dr. Downham ordered that no more patients be admitted to the Talbot street hospital. On the day previous twelve patients had been discharged, and Mrs. Thomson was expecting to take in three more instead of them. However, owing to Dr. Downham's orders one was sent to the Victoria Hospital, and the other two to the Maitland street institution. These latter two died. Mrs. Thomson remarked to the members of the board that their chance of recovery was diminished as a result of the delay in getting them to the hospital. All three of these patients had contracted pneumonia before reaching the hospitals.

41 Nurses Sent Out.

The summary showed that 41 nurses had been sent out by the division, and that 12 nurses were still on duty. Seven nurses desired to receive pay for their services. The nurses paid their own carfare or walked to the houses of patients which they were to visit. Two girls who did not go home, for fear that they might carry the disease germs to those at home paid for a room and board out of their own pocket. Chairman E. H. Russell asked whether these nurses were registered. 41 Nurses Sent Out.

Mrs. Thompson replied that some of them had gone to register, but were told that they belonged to the Institute of Public Health. The chairman said that he understood some of the nurses worked right through until October 31 without registering. He also understood that they had received no recompense.

H. M. Douglass then asked the chairman if he thought there were 1,000 cases in the city which were unable to pay for treatment received. Mr. Russell then turned to Miss Friend, ho was accompanied at the meeting by Mrs. J. B. McKillop, and asked he what her experience was in regard to this matter. She stated that not 10 per cent of her patients could have to Miss

well isolated. Acting on the suggestion of Dr. Tamlin the board appointed Dr. A. Scott to aid him in taking samples of milk for test purposes. The chairman remarked that the Public Health Institute of the state of t remarked that the Public Health Institute only charged 25 cents for a test, whereas the cost of each test amounted to 60 cents. Mayor Somerville declared that at a meeting of the board of control held a week ago, it had been decided to pay the institute \$1,000 for this purpose. The mayor urged that those who broke the orders of the board of health by selling impure milk and by health by selling impure milk and by using dirty bottles should be dealt with

severely, as such conditions might cause the deaths of infants.

Dr. Tamlin thought that those who broke the health rules should be puntheir businesses until they lived up to the health rules.

"A thanksgiving service on the happy termination of the great war will take place in St. Peter's Cathedral on Tuesday morning at 10 a.m. There will also be a memorial service for our dead soldiers at the same hour and place on Wednesday morning."


