### HOME ECONOMICS

THE SHIRTWAIST PATTERN.

A young girl often begins her own sewing by making for herself a shirtwaist. It looks easy, but it needs study and care, to insure good fit and right lines. A girl who has found a good foundation for more elaborate sewing.

The back width is measured between the bone at the back of the neck and the waist, keeping the tape straight across the back. This measurement is important, as it affects the fit around the shoulders. The neck measurement should be easy enough for comfort in breathing and movement. waist pattern for herself has a good foundation for more elaborate sewing.

Use a commercial pattern of good make and simple style, and go slowly. Study each piece of the pattern, front, back, sleeves, cuffs, neck band, and placket facing. 
