NINETY-TWO LOADS AT THE CITY MARKET

Quality Cattle Medium—Trade Slow and Prices Easier—Hogs \$8.75 Per Cwt.

There were about 200 carloads of live stock at the city market for Wednesday and Thursday.

The bulk of the supply of cattle at the city market was of common quality. Nothing choice was received, and the demand for the good grades was in the proportion of one to five of the common.

Anything approaching good was in the demand and easily disposed of, but the trouble was that there were few of them.

Trade for sheep, lambs and calves was about steady.

Cattle all round are fully 25c per cwt. lower than they were early last week.

Calves are very scarce, and everything on the market, everything else having gone down in value, and looks like going still lower, and calves have gone down in price, but are being held up well, with no sign of getting cheaper.

The Jewish holidays are near at hand, and that will to a certain extent affect the meat trade, as the fast lasts for nine days.

Fat Cattle Prices.

Few butchers cattle received for market, the best quality on this market for a week or more. The best quality of fat cattle is selling at \$5.35 and \$5.50, and there were few of them as will be seen, by sales given below.

Medium cattle, \$4.75 to \$5.25, and common at \$4.50 to \$4.75; cows at \$3.75, with few at larger quotations.

Stockers and Feeders.

Stockers and feeders demand. Robert Wilson of Murphy & Wilson report their firm buying about 200 at \$5.50, and 100 at \$5.00, and 100 at \$4.50. The bulk sold for \$4.75 to \$5.25, and common at \$4.50 to \$4.75; cows at \$3.75, with few at larger quotations.

Milkers and Springers.

The market continues strong for good milkers and springers, as we have seen in sales quoted below, ranging from \$25 to \$30, and one at \$35. The bulk sold for \$25 to \$30.

Sheep and Lambs.

Sheep sold at about steady prices, while lambs were easier, as follows: Ewes, \$4.00 to \$4.50; rams, \$4.25 to \$4.50; lambs, \$3.75 to \$4.00.

The packers still quote steady, and we have seen in sales quoted below, ranging from \$8 to \$9, and one at \$10. The bulk sold for \$8 to \$9.
