COAL MEN HERE
IN A QUANDARY

Not Yet Informed if Price
Reductions Affect Cana-
dian Receipts.

LARGE STOCKS HELD

Dealers Fear Their Values
Will Be Halved by
Regulations.

Following the slashing reduction in
the bituminous coal prices made by
the Washington administration, Cana-
dian consumers and dealers are in
doubt as to just where they "get off."
If these new figures apply to Canada,
as well as to the American market,
as they should, if there has been the
promised harmony between the Cana-
dian fuel controller, Mr. Magrath, and
the American Government, what is to
be the selling price of the large stocks
of high-priced coal now in Canada?

What is to be the fate of the exist-
ing contracts between Canadian buyers
and the American operators?

According to some reports, existing
contracts stand, but the price of the
dispatch state that they are void. If
the existing contracts stand, then the
forfeited consumers who contracted
for their supply early in the season
will have to pay over twice as much
for his coal as the man who did not.

On the other hand, if the contracts
stand, then the dealer who has secured
part of his stock of high-priced coal,
may have to pocket a
loss or hang on to the coal, trusting
that a shortage may cause the price
to be lifted or the price ad-
vanced.

If the contracts stand then it is not
likely that the operator will sell coal
at the lower figures, but will allow it
to be handled thru brokers at an ad-
vance. This will prevent the Cana-
dian buyer from getting a better price
than an American operator.

Conditions at upper lake ports pre-
sent another problem. Between one-
half and two-thirds of the winter
supply has been sent north by water
and this has all been secured at about
double the present price. The rest
may be secured at the lower price,
and the question is at what price will
the coal be sold at this winter?

Soft Coal Scarcity

Under the conditions prevailing
there is very little soft coal crossing
the border, and it is next to impos-
sible to get a quotation on any grade
of soft coal at the present time.

Some buyers, who are in close
touch with the situation, are con-
gratulating themselves that they have
secured their supply, as they feel that
the new regulation will practically
cut down the supply coming over from
the United States to a minimum, and that
the winter will see a greater shortage
than ever.

Yesterday Buffalo dealers were in-
formed that anyone shipping coal by
water would be enabled to secure a
one hundred per cent. car supply to
take such shipments to the lake or
coastal ports from the mines, but that
all-shipments were now a second-
ary consideration and would remain
so for the rest of the period of naviga-
tion.

While the market is in such a pecu-
liar condition there are men taking
advantage of the situation and who
are making enticing offers. One man
was reported to be offering to sell
Toronto at the present time, claiming
to be working for the fuel controller,
and able to look after contracts up to
half a million tons. Needless to say,
he is not on Mr. Magrath's staff.

MUNITION FACTORIES HAVE
CUT OUTPUT IN TWO

Many Employees Laid Off and Only
Skilled Mechanics Retained.

The various munition factories in
the city have responded to the order
of the imperial munitions board to
cut their output in two, and as a re-
sult have laid off many of their em-
ployees. The only persons now assur-
ed of steady employment in this line
of occupation are the skilled mechanic
and the highly efficient workman.

Practically all the munition factories
have laid off or given some other form
of employment to their shell and fuse
makers.

The Fairbanks-Morse has closed its
women department entirely. About
800 workers in all have been laid off,
more than half of them being women.

There are still about 1500 men at
work. It is stated that mechanical and
skilled workers would not suffer,
their services being still required.

The others were advised to return to
their former employment or seek
some new form of work.

The Russell Company released 500
men and 2000 women workers are
still employed. The night shifters
are being eliminated in most factories
and the hours reduced. In releasing
women workers the Russell Company
has exercised care that the needy
should be retained rather than the
woman of leisure.

Thames-Harris Company does
not employ women and the 150 men
released recently have been given the
opportunity of engaging in some other
form of work for their families. About
150 men are still retained on munition
work.

The A. B. Ormsby Co. has 100 men
at work on munitions, and has done
away with the night shift. The A.B.
Chalmers Company is practically the
only company which is taking on new
workers, and doing so in order to
complete an unfinished contract.

MAJOR WATTS WITH B. E. F.

Advice has been received that
Major E. M. Watts of the 198th Bat-
talion, Canadian Buffs, has been loaned
to the British Expeditionary Force
company. Definite and definite state-
ment would not be forthcoming, how-
ever, he said, until the board of di-
rectors met and decide the ques-
tion. The board is expected to meet
soon, he added.

Statements made at the office of
St. William Mackenzie, president of
the company, and by members of the
board of directors, coincided with the
belief expressed by Assistant Man-
ager Hubbard.

If the award is accepted it will
mean the disbursement of an addi-
tional \$600,000 by the company. The
men \$11,250, the company, \$400,
