TRAIN HIT DYNAMITE.

Engine and Nine Cars Wrecked and Two Men Killed.

Cumberland, Md., Sept. 23.—A wagon loaded with 19 cases of dynamite was struck by a Baltimore and Ohio fast freight train at a road crossing at North Branch, Va., near here to-day, and an explosion followed. The engine and nine cars were wrecked, and the track torn up for a distance of one hundred feet. Two men were killed, and several others injured, two seriously. Two rest-houses in the neighborhood were destroyed. The lower and interlocking plants were practically destroyed. The driver of the wagon containing the dynamite was demolished, no building for a considerable distance escaping damage. The horses attached to the wagon were blown fifty yards into a field. According to eye witnesses James Laine, the driver of the wagon, on which the train became stalled and stopped on the track. The wagon was within three feet of clearing it when the engine struck the rear end, carrying it fifty feet before the explosion occurred.

HELD UP BY THREE MEN.

William Warner of 19 Elizabeth-street says he was held up on Geddes Wharf at 1.30 o'clock this morning, and as a result of the encounter he was taken to the hospital. Warner's story is that he was walking along the wharf when he was stopped by three men. One of the men, who was armed with a revolver, forced Warner to get into a small boat. The other two men then searched Warner and took his money. Warner was then taken to the hospital, where he is now recovering from his injuries.

BLEW OUT THE GAS.

Quelph, Sept. 23.—About half-past one this afternoon a fire broke out in the kitchen of a house at 1000 St. George-st. The fire was caused by a gas leak, and it spread rapidly, burning for some time before being extinguished. The house was damaged, and the family was forced to leave.

At 4 o'clock the party entered the historic Fort Garry, where they were entertained at luncheon by C. C. Chilman of the Hudson Bay Company. The presentation of the King's colors to the Royal Canadian Mounted Rifles was the great spectacle of the afternoon. The great square was roped off on the grounds of Fort Osborne barracks and a platform erected for distinguished visitors.
