

A horsesteader may live within nime miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongstide his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from Moncton, daily (ar-rives at Island Yard.)
