#### BASEBALL

"Red" Oldham to Leave Game.

Los Angeles, Cal., Nov. 28.—Red Oldham, pitcher for the Detroit Tigers, who is under investigation by Commissioner K. M. Landis on the charge of laying winter baseball here, has announced he will retire from organized baseball and go into business, according to his friends. Bill Pierce, who also was cited by Judge Landis for playing winter baseball, is quoted as saying "I had permission from Harry H. Case, owner of the Boston Red Sox, to play if ineligible players are not on the roster."

#### BOXING

Would Battle Dempsey.

New York, Nov. 28.—Harry Greb, Pittsburgh light heavy-weight who holds the American championship title, renewed his claims for a bout against Jack Dempsey for the world's heavy-weight crown. Greb, on a visit to Madison Square Garden for the purpose of arranging final details in connection with his return bout with Gene Tunney on Dec. 29, declared his readiness to battle Dempsey if the match can be arranged. Greb, in discussing his qualifications for a heavy-weight title scrap, pointed out his victories over Billy Brannen, Billy Burke, Tommy Gibbons, Charlie Fennell and Tunney, as performances which made him eligible for consideration as a rival for Dempsey. The Pittsburgh boxer wore plaster patches over both eyes. He explained the decorations were a precaution against the cold weather aggravating cuts over the eyes. Greb confirmed his "break" with the manager, George Engel, but added that he intended to fulfill contracts, which Engel had signed for him before the disagreement between boxer and manager occurred.

**ENGLISH CRICKET TEAM ABROAD**

**A. G. McLaren, Veteran, Gets Hearty Welcome on Tour of Australia.**

London, Nov. 27.—(By Canadian Press)—It was almost like getting back home for A. G. McLaren, veteran cricketer of Leamington, to visit Australia as captain of the Marylebone cricket team which is now touring Australia and intends to make a tour of New Zealand before returning to England, and the welcome he received showed this. His present visit is the fourth he has made to Australia, and although a new generation has learned the game of cricket in that time he still has his old-time popularity in that far-off domain.

It is twenty-eight years since Mr. McLaren first visited Australia, as a member of Mr. Stoddard's team. He then introduced himself to the cricketers there with an innings of 226 runs in the first innings of the Melbourne cricket ground. In 1897 he returned with Mr. Stoddard's second team, and in 1901 he paid his third visit. On the fourth occasion he was captain of the English team. He was always extraordinarily successful on Australian wickets, and he had an average of more than 61 extending over his three previous visits.

Mr. McLaren's team, so far in this, his fourth tour, has not pursued a conquering course in Australia. It began

**PARTY AT WINDSOR A LIVELY AFFAIR**

Crown Attorney Investigates Reports of "Classic" Dancing.

Windsor, Ont., Nov. 28.—George A. Urquhart, Crown Attorney of Essex county, declared that he would begin an investigation into a party held in a local hall by a sporting association at which nude dancers are said to have furnished the entertainment.

Mr. Urquhart said that such affairs would be carefully guarded against in future, and if such reveals occurred again, policemen might be detailed to attend all parties and banquets. Meanwhile, the crown attorney said that prosecutions may be launched if responsibility for this affair can be definitely established.

The Border Cities Ministerial Association will also undertake an investigation, so Rev. M. Gordon Melvin, the president said.
