SAYS THAT HE FORGED CHECKS

Dennis Bulford Asks to Be Arrested — Says He is Nephew of High C. P. R. Official.

New York, March 3. — (Canadian Press).—Declaring himself to be Dennis Bulford, a surveyor of Ottawa, a man last night requested the police here to arrest him on a charge of having forged several checks in Canada, using the name of J. S. Dennis, assistant to the president of the C. P. R., who, he alleged, is his uncle. The man was detained pending inquiry. He said he currently resided because his conscience was troubling him.

According to the police, Bulford admitted forgery which netted him \$800 on one occasion, and \$250 on another, the last offence having been committed on January 18 in Edmonton. In defence of his act, the man is said to have stated that he wanted to get away from the police of Alberta, who were hounding him because they suspected him in connection with the disappearance of a package of mail containing \$50,000. He declares he was guiltless.

WILL TRY TO STOP PILFERING

Representatives of Steamship Companies Discuss Problems With Executive of Commercial Club.

At a meeting of the executive of the Commercial Club, yesterday afternoon, it was resolved to invite the council of the board of trade and the executive of the Rotary club to meet in conference with representatives of shipping interests and formulate a request to be presented to the city council in the matter of bettering and of better protection at the west side wharves and warehouses.

C. H. Peters, the president, was in the chair, and a delegation representing the shipping interests was heard. R. L. Charlton was present on behalf of the marine underwriters. Capt. Elliot, of the C. P. R. S. told of an interview that the shipping men had had with the city council regarding the matter of bettering and of better protection at the west side wharves and warehouses.

W. H. Shaw, D. W. Ledingham and Thomas Nagle cited specific cases of pilfering. Mr. Charlton said that St. John was regarded as one of the worst points for pilfering, and this was a very bad advertisement for the port. He also said that the city had only \$200,000 insurance on \$2,000,000 worth of property on the west side, which might be wiped out in a night.

After the shipping men had retired, the executive of the club discussed the situation, and it was decided that the
