FREIGHT HANDLERS

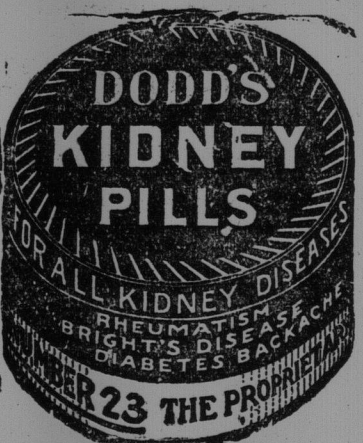

This work was awarded to the Freight Handlers' Union by the decision of the Waterfront District Council, representative of all the waterfront unions, at a meeting last Thursday evening. A committee composed of J. A. Brittain, Wm. Hammond and Edward McGinnis was appointed to interview the shippers and railways to arrange for the transference of this work which was formerly done by the longshoremen.

GIRL WINS VALOR MEDAL

London, Sept. 16—Miss Elizabeth Bowry, of Surrey, has been awarded a medal of valor for diving fully dressed into one of the lakes at Kew Gardens and rescuing a drowning boy. The boy had gone down for the third time when the girl reached him and swam with him to the shore where he was revived.

Kaiser's Window Remains

London, Sept. 16—The stained glass window presented to the Dovecourt Parish church by former Kaiser William, of Germany, twenty years ago will be permitted to remain. The Rev. T. Grey and the church wardens have decided that it shall not be removed until "another as good or better is presented to the church." Captain Pryatt is buried in the churchyard there.



ENGLISH NEWSPAPER REPRESENTATIVES IN TROUBLE IN RUSSIA

London, Sept. 16—According to Reuters telegram received from Stockholm the Helsingfors newspaper Sotall Demokratists states that the correspondent of the Manchester Guardian, Professor Goode, has been arrested by the Estonian authorities at Reval at the request of the British authorities. Goode was subsequently released and is now aboard a ship pending arrangements for his return to England. Some weeks ago Goode sent a message from London to Litvinoff, asking permission to visit Moscow to examine conditions. He spent a few weeks in Moscow. The labor paper, the Daily Herald, this morning suggests that Goode was bringing a fresh peace offer from the Soviet government to the Entente. It says that in well-informed circles in London it was generally believed that such a peace offer had been made personally by Lenin to a British journalist who was on his way home from Russia.

The Daily Herald, commenting, says: "Can it be that the government wants to suppress and deny news of proposals made to William Bullitt last March? If so, it adds the final touch to the whole scandalous story of the Russian war."

Incorporation for Albert. Hopewell Hill, N. B., Sept. 15—With a vote of more than three to one, taken on a property valuation basis the residents of Albert Village today voted in favor of the adoption of the provision of the act of the legislature giving incorporation of the village for water and fire purposes.
