

STARVING BOY TO DEATH

Charge Against Former Justice of the Peace and His Wife

Dublin, Dec. 13-At Newton Butler a magisterial investigation was held before Robert Sparrow into a charge preferred against John George Crozier, justice of the peace of Gontara House, county Fermanagh, a former high sheriff of that county, and his wife, Jessie Florence Crozier, of starving to death John Spencer Noel Crozier, aged sixteen, a son of Mr. Crozier by a previous marriage. They were also charged with wilful neglect and neglect of two other children, a boy of eight and a girl of fourteen.

Dr. Francis Creighton Fitzgerald deposed that the body of the deceased boy, John, was dreadfully emaciated, the bones almost cutting the skin. There were abrasions on some of the knuckles and the neck, and small ulcers and excoriations on the lower portion of the legs. He said the boy must have been wasting away, and receiving wilful neglect, for at least three months before his death.

The accused were committed for trial for manslaughter.
