ECONOMY IN ELECTRICITY IS PLANNED BY LONDON

don's electric lighting bill will be cut by \$5,000,000 yearly, it is believed when a project now in course of com

when a project now in course of com-pletion is made effective.

This provides for the uniting of all electrical supply companies in London and the suburbs, covering an area of 1,660 square miles and affecting a pop-ulation of close to eight million peo-ple. There will be only twelve gener-ating stations, in the whole area, against about fifty now in existence, and the saving will allow of a reduc-tion in cost of something like 15 per cent per unit.
