CONCILIATION BOARD REPORT IS ISSUED

SYDNEY, N. S., Feb. 13-The miners have decided to reject the counter-proposal made by the British Empire Steel Corporation for the settlement of present wage dispute, it was amnounced here this afternoon.

The company, after refusing to accept the miners' programme for a four months' period of work at the old rate pending an inquiry submitted the following proposition:

"That the company and the U. M. W. of A. enter forthwith into a contract to continue until Nov. 30, 1926, providing that."


"An impartial committee of investi-gation be constituted by either one or wo members being appointed by the representatives of the employes and the same númber by the company, these representatives to agree on a chairman.

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OTTAWA, Feb. 13—The report of the Winfield Conciliation Board respecting the dispute between the Cape Breton coal miners and the British Empire Steel Corpoartion declares that "no permanent inaprovement in industrial relations can be expected until complete confidence is established between the operators and employes."

The board is unanimously of the oplnion (a) that due to the unfortunate relations existing for many years between the operators and the employes, as set forth in the statement of the employes submitted to the Minister and further elaborated in the statement submitted to the board, no permanent improvement in industrial relations can be expected until complete confidence is established between the operators and the employes, which may be possibly brought about by a fair and impartial inquiry by a competent authority, with a view to ascertaining the actual necessary cost of mining, transporting and selling coal, the ability of the companies to pay a rate of wages satisfactory to the employes, to earn a fair return on capital invested, and the bearing which the attitude and action of the employes have in relation to the efficient and profitable carrying on of the operations."
