Reforms are certainly needed in the post office system on Labrador. We know of a case where three or four letters were sent from a certain place on the Labrador to a party in Newfoundland, and not one letter reached its destination. The Department should take stern measures to have these irregularities stopped. It should be impressed upon postal officials that they are public servants, and no person or any other matter should interfere with their public duties. We complained about these irregularities several weeks ago, but at this writing no explanation has been given. The public business of this country needs to be placed on a business like basis.

NEWS IN A LINE

The German fleet still rests on an even keel.

Citizens of Newfoundland who reside on the Labrador are disenfranchised. This should not be. The time is coming when the people of Labrador will have some say in connection with public matters.

A move is on foot in England to form an Anglo-French war council. It is hoped that Russia and Italy will appoint representatives thereto.
