CLOSING LETTER OF N. Y. MARKET BY E. & C. RANDOLPH

New York, Jan. 26.—Heavy liquidation both for local and foreign accounts was felt in the market throughout the afternoon and carried practically the entire list well below yesterday's close. Practically no buying was influenced by the favorable showing of the Steel Corporation and the declaration of the dividend was awaited to liquidate long lines of stock where the holders had at last become tired of waiting for the market to respond to favorable news, and decided to get out and wait for the completion of the liquidation and opportunities to replace their long at lower prices. The way the market has failed to respond to developments which naturally would be of a bullish nature is a good indication that it will easily respond to any bad news and is likely to offer such opportunities. Some bankers believe the foreign liquidation is not far from an end and it may be that it is now less carefully handled. A decline of over 4 points in C. P. R., and substantial losses in U. P. and S. P., and New York Central indicated that it was going on today. Anaconda which has recently been strong was also one of the greatest sufferers, together with A. R. Steel common continued to slide by far the most active issue of a dividend will tend to stop foreign selling of it, it was as weak as the rest of the market.

Further Foreign Liquidation and Unsettled in Domestic Affairs Responsible - Bethlehem Steel Dropped 17 1/2 Points to 456 - Bond Market Heavy.

New York, Jan. 26.—The trend of today's session must have been a source of disappointment to those who hoped that the constructive factors implied by the resumption of the United States Steel common dividend and that corporation's remarkable statement of earnings would lift the market out of its recent pessimistic mood. Stocks were strong at the outset, mainly in consequence of extensive short coverings, but before the noon hour prices receded, with a succession of irregular declines, which more than offset the most initial gains. In fact, minimum quotations were lowest, in many instances, for weeks past.

Various theories were again offered to explain the market's failure to respond to good news. Further foreign liquidation was accepted as the chief obstacle, although domestic developments, such as the threatened contest between the railroads and their employees, assumed increased importance. Washington's refusal to accede to Berlin's terms in the settlement of the Lusitania incident also figured in the calculations of the trading element. United States Steel was, of course, the foremost feature opening with an offering of 1,500 shares at 86 to 85 1/2, declining later to 83 1/2 and closing at that price, a net loss of a point. Deal-
