Has Received Over \$200,000,000

Return in Parliament Shows Extent of Grants

Sir Richard McBride Anxious to Unload British Columbia's \$33,000,000 Guarantee of C. N. R. Bonds on Dominion to Bolster Up the Province's Credit.

In addition to this there is the grant of 2,000,000 acres of land to the Canadian Northern Ontario. Railway made by the province of Ontario. No estimate has yet been made as to the cash value of this land grant.

With regard to the land grant of 4,102,848 acres made by the dominion government and referred to above, the company's own statement as furnished to the railway department gives cash received from sales of these lands up to June 30, 1910, amounting to \$5,222,547. The lands remaining to be sold were valued on that date by the company at not less than \$14,000,000. That makes altogether a total of \$20,222,547 as the value of the land grants exclusive of the 2,000,000 acres granted by Ontario.

Accepting as correct the figures as supplied today by the federal government and the figures as to provincial aid which are quoted from the statement submitted to the railway commission when the western freight rates case was being heard, this gives a grand total of cash and land subsidies amounting to \$56,306,988, and of bond guarantees amounting to \$147,190,790. Adding these amounts together the total amount of financial assistance thus far granted to the road is \$205,497,776.

It is stated today that Sir Richard McBride is asking the Borden government to relieve British Columbia of a part of the bond guarantees totalling over \$38,000,000 assumed by that province in connection with the Pacific end of the C. N. R. transcontinental.

The staggering amount of the obligation assumed by the McBride government is said to be seriously affecting the credit of the province in the negotiation of new loans. Moreover a federal guarantee replacing part of the provincial guarantee will be welcomed by MacKenzie & Mann as improving this chances of raising money on better terms.
