MINING WORK IN THE ROCKLES

The gross value of British Colum bia's mineral production for the year 1918 was \$41.782,474, an increase from that of the year 1917 of \$4,772,082, or 12.9 per cent., according to the annual report of the Mimister of Mines. The gross value of the metallic minerals recovered in 1918 was \$27,910,278, which represents an increase of 2.3 per cent. The provincial mine ralogist, Mr. Fleet Robertson, in commenting on these figures, states that only once in the history of the provinces' mineral ertson, in commenting once in the history of the provinces' mineral statities has this output been exceeded and that was in 1916, when the year's min eral output amounted to \$42,290.462, only 1.2 per cent greater than in 1918. This is accounted for by the fact that 1916 was a phenomenal year withmetal prices temporarily inflated, due to war conditions. As compared with earlier years, he points out that the production of 1918 shows up even more favorably for it exceeds the next highest recorded production—\$42,440,800, made in 1912—by \$9,341,674, or about 29 per cen.
