

WILLIAM EDWARD BAUER

Mr. Bauer was born in Welland, Ontario on May 23, 1926; he attended Queen's University from which he received a B. A. and an M. A. From 1949-1951 he was on the staff of the "Kingston Whig-Standard".

Mr. Bauer entered the Public Service in 1951 when he joined the National Research Council. The following year he transferred to the Department of External Affairs and has since served in Ottawa, and abroad in Warsaw (1953), in Indochina as Adviser to the Canadian Commissioners of the International Supervisory Commissions (1955), Rome (1959), in Geneva on the Laos Delegation (May 1961-March 1962), at the Canadian Permanent Mission to the United Nations in Geneva (1962) and in Washington (1967). Mr. Bauer was President of the Professional Association of Foreign Service Officers from January 1966 to July 1967.

Mr. Bauer is married to Nona Karneyeff and they have two children.
