M., 6 Jan., 1876, Fannie, dau. of the late Thos. Parks, Esq., of St. John. Called to the Bar N.B. 27 June, 1872, and was reporter of the Supreme Court for ten years. Apptd. Q.C. by Dom. Govt. 4 Feb., 1891. First returned to House of Assem. July, 1885, on death of sitting mem. Dr. Vail, re-elected at g.e. 1886 and 1890. Was Speaker of the House from 3 March, 1887, to May, 1889, when sworn a mem. of the Ex. Council and apptd. Solr.-Gen. An Independent.—*St. John, N.B.*

ROBINSON, JAMES. (*Northumberland.*)

Parents came from Scotland. B. at Derby, N.B., and ed. there. M., 1877, Miss Grace McDonald. Is a merchant, lumberman and manager of the South West Miramichi Boom and Lumber Co., and dir. of the New Castle, Miramichi Spool Factory, Ltd. Has been a Co. Councillor since 1879, and Warden of the Co. for three years. First returned to House of Assem. at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Derby, Millarton, N.B.*

ROURKE JAMES. (*St John County*)

B. at Musquash, N.B., 27 June 1838. Ed. at the Parish School. M., 16 Mar. 1871 Charlotte, dau. of Capt. Wishart. Is a lumber manufacturer, and is Capt. of the St. Martins Co. of Rifles, V.M. Has been a member of the Municipal Council of St. John. An unsuccessful candidate for St. John City and County in Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1888. First returned to the Ho. of Assembly at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*St Martins, N.B.*

RUSSELL, JAMES. (*Charlotte.*)

Grandfather a native of Haddington, Scot., came to Halifax, N.S., with the Royal Engineers, fought in the Am. Revol. war, and afterwards settled in N.B. B. in St. Andrews, N.B., 15 Nov., 1824, and ed. there. M., 26 March, 1851, Agnes McDonald, of Wigton, Scot. Is a farmer, a magistrate and a County Councillor. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e., 1886, and re-elected at last g.e., 1890, by acclamation. An Independent.—*Bayside, St. Croix, N.B.*
